## The Honorable E. Norman Veasey to Lead Development Efforts

We were all grateful for the life of Donald C. Taylor and saddened by his passing on May 6, 2005 at the age of 75. Don served tirelessly and faithfully as Chair of the Cathedral Choir School of Delaware's "Continuing the Tradition" Endowment Fund. Last November the Choir School bestowed upon Don the Royal School of Church Music's "Loyal Service Medal" for his service to the Choir since 1938.

We are pleased to announce that The Honorable E. Norman Veasey has agreed to Chair the Cathedral Choir School of Delaware's Development Committee. This Committee raises support for the Endowment Fund and the Annual Scholarship Fund. Norm is excited about carrying on the work that Don Taylor and others started. He sang in the Men and Boys Choir of the Cathedral in the 1940's and considers his time in the Choir "a very formative experience" that taught him about being a responsible leader and citizen in the community. The Veasey family has sung in the Choir for multiple generations as sons Doug and Kip sang in the Choir in the 1970's. Judge Veasey retired last year as Chief Justice of the Delaware Supreme Court. Bishop of Delaware Wayne P. Wright said, "His leadership will be a significant contribution in the important campaign to underwrite financially the Cathedral Choir School."

## Progress on the Longwood Match

Last December, the Cathedral Choir School of Delaware received a grant from the Longwood Foundation of up to \$50,000 to match 1:1 contributions to its Annual Scholarship Fund (after a benchmark of \$25,000 was raised). Thanks to new and increased giving to the Scholarship Fund, we are close to the \$75,000 needed to secure the Longwood Foundation grant. ## Artistic Director's Note

One of the many wonderful things about being affiliated with the Royal School of Church Music is that its methods can be adapted to so many different situations. In addition, all of us who are responsible for training choristers have a great deal that we can learn from one another. I personally believe that the time I have spent

with colleagues, discussing and observing their programs, has been as significant for me as my formal education.

Recently, our staff has had several opportunities to share information about the Cathedral Choir School with a variety of churches, professional organizations and seminaries. In the course of this year, our former Dean, The Very Reverend Peggy Patterson, and I were among thirty clergy and church musicians selected from across the country to serve as consultants for the Anglican Musicians' Seminary Music Initiative (AMSMI) to share our experiences in developing collegial relationships and effective music programs that have revitalized congregations. Peggy and I will have another opportunity to address this topic with Dr. Carol Doran at The Virginia Theological Seminary, Alexandria, Virginia this September. I also was delighted to join two other church musicians and speak at the third Professional Concerns meeting during the 2005 Association of Anglican Musicians Conference in Baltimore this summer. We each shared unique stories about our respective programs that could serve as models for other churches.

Other opportunities to discuss the program arise when we receive inquiries from clergy and staff from other churches. Some people will make arrangements to spend several days at the Cathedral to observe rehearsals and ask questions while other people will collect information by a series of e-mails and phone calls. During the past year, we have had the pleasure of communicating with churches in Arizona, Connecticut, Delaware, Indiana, Massachusetts, Tennessee, and Washington, D.C. Invariably, we all find ourselves with new, innovative, and effective ways to motivate and train choristers.

## In the Choir

These articles were written by Choristers Keyanna and Angel and presented at a Breakfast to benefit the Cathedral Choir School held on May 10, 2005.



Hello. My name is Angel and I am in 7th grade. I started in the Cathedral Choir School of Delaware at the age of seven years and now I am thirteen years old. So if you add up the years, it would be six years that I have been in the Choir School. The things I like best about being in Choir are going

on trips to see beautiful churches and the trip to England was the best.

I started out as a treble chorister. It was good for the time being. Then in the 6th grade my voice started to change and then I was an Alto for half the year, then Dr. Roland put me in the Tenor section which is the best part ever! With the help of adult singers like Jill, Wally and Dan, it was easy for me to match the Tenor part. I am still a Tenor and I think I have improved since last year.

Dr. Roland has influenced the whole Choir, but he influenced me by helping me when I needed it. Dr. Roland gives people second chances. He will help you even when he is in the middle of something else, so that is very generous. Choir has helped me in school a lot because it gives me a place to be after school. And my grades have gone up, because Choir really helps me focus on my school work.

The number one thing I will remember about Choir is going on trips like to England, and to Choir Camp in Pennsylvania. My plans for my future are to get a scholarship to go to Duke University and graduate.

I will remember everything about the Choir School, including my friends and my favorite songs and the conductors that I have met.



## My name is Keyanna.

I am 13 years old and in 7th grade. I joined the Cathedral Choir School of Delaware shortly after my 11th birthday. The Choir School has presented me with many opportunities as far as learning music theory and skill, as well as performance technique and etiquette.

At the Choir School, we get to put our performance skills to use by going on a lot of trips. For example, in the summer of 2003 we took a trip to England. Here we sang in some of the most beautiful and historic cathedrals and got to experience traditional as well as modern English culture.

Each year, the Choir School sponsors ten choristers to go to the Royal School of Church Music's residential summer camp at King's College in Pennsylvania. I was lucky enough to go to this camp, where I got to stay on a college campus, meet new people from around the country, and learn more about what it means to be a chorister.

The Choir School has introduced me to many talented and interesting people who mean a lot to me, like the organist Mr. Boatman, the adult singers in the Cathedral Choir, and especially Dr. Roland our Choirmaster. He has done so much for me ... whether it was choir related or otherwise, and anyone would be lucky to have someone like him in their lives. I really love to sing, dance and would like to be an actress some day. So when the Choir School was invited to be a part of Opera Delaware's Turandot I was very excited. Dr. Roland chose 15 choristers to fill the slots for the children's chorus in the opera. Along with the chorus, I got to play the part of a Ribbon Dancer. The Cathedral Choir School of Delaware has done a lot of things for me. It has influenced my life, including my plans for college, where I would like to complete a double major in Musical Theatre and Journalism.

## Senior Choral Mentor Evelyn Burnam

This past Choir Season there were four outstanding adults who served as "Senior Choral Mentors" for Cathedral Choir School students. Senior Choral Mentors are professionally trained singers who mentor the younger choristers through their presence at rehearsals and performances. They allow the young treble choristers to sing a complex and historic repertoire. They help young men, in particular, as their

voices change to learn a new skill and confidence in their adult male voice so that they can move into alto/tenor/baritone singing roles with the adults of the Choir. Senior Choral Mentors also provide important role models to young girls as they move through their adolescent years.

Evelyn Burnam, a Senior Choral Mentor, is the leader of the Alto section of the Choir. Evelyn's love of music began in her childhood. Her father was a choral and theater director. Evelyn has served as an elementary school teacher and has taught K-12 music. She has also directed children's theater in Cecil County, Maryland, as her son and daughter were growing up. She knew about the Cathedral Church of Saint John and its music program in the 1970's when Herbert Tinney was the Choirmaster. She referred children she knew and thought could benefit to the program.

Evelyn sang with the Choir during its England Choir Tour 2003. "This Tour was like magic," she said. "It really turned the group into a cohesive team by singing four times a day together. After this Tour the Choir's sound was different. It took on a new level of excellence."

Evelyn's son Christian also sings with the intergenerational Cathedral Choir. Christian knows what it is like to be a Treble chorister. He attended St. Thomas Choir School, which is a residential choir school in New York City serving boys in the fifth through eighth grades.

Evelyn is very impressed by the fact that the Cathedral Choir School is able to retain young men as their voices change and they move into adolescence by incorporating them into the other sections of the Choir. "I think choristers should remain Trebles as long as possible because that is where they learn to sing and are singing with their peers, but it is great that the Cathedral Choir School has figured out how to move these young men into other sections of the Choir as they mature. At other choir schools they would have had to stop singing, or serve as an acolyte if this was an available choice."

Evelyn believes that the Cathedral Choir School provides a different experience for each child. "For some children who might have trouble fitting in elsewhere, they can fit into a small group at the Cathedral Choir School where they are not judged by their appearance or their background, but rather by their ability to sing. The children do come from many different backgrounds, but the Cathedral Choir School is a great 'equalizing' force. Children who might not otherwise socialize or go to the movies together are getting to know each other through the Choir School. And, the Choir School can really be a 'rock of support' for a child. It provides the kind of environment where you can really zero in on one child and give him or her personal attention."
